By 2050, India's urban population is expected to surge dramatically, with the **World Bank projecting it to touch 675 million by 2035**. By mid-century, India will be more urban than rural, with an urbanization rate nearing 40%. This demographic shift calls for a renewed and comprehensive approach to integrated, inclusive and sustainable urban transport systems. In response, several pioneering projects and initiatives have been introduced to popularize ecofriendly mobility solutions and promote cleaner, greener urban transport networks. **Government of India** has notably accelerated the adoption and manufacturing of hybrid and electric vehicles through the **National Electric Mobility Mission Plan**.

The pace of intercity and interstate connectivity has grown exponentially, with smaller cities and towns being actively prioritized alongside major urban centres. In keeping with this vision, the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) has undertaken noteworthy initiatives for electric buses, advancing the SUM-ACA (Sustainable Urban Mobility – Air Quality, Climate Action and Accessibility) programme, extending technical and financial support for Transit Oriented Development (TOD) projects, driving large-scale capacity building efforts and advocating for fare integration. A notable milestone has been the National Common Mobility Card (NCMC) launched in 2019, enabling seamless multi-modal travel nationwide.

The recently launched **National Logistics Policy (NLP) 2022-23** aspires to establish a technologically advanced, cost-effective, integrated and resilient logistics framework that can fuel accelerated, inclusive and sustainable economic growth. Through strategic prioritization, synchronization and integration, these initiatives aim to enhance transport infrastructure and services at multiple urban and regional levels.

This year's conference theme, "Urban Development & Mobility Nexus", aptly captures the vital interplay between mobility, infrastructure, demographics and policy that shapes livelihoods and quality of life in urban spaces. It thoughtfully reflects not only the journey thus far, but also road ahead. I am confident that the UMI Conference-cum-Exhibition 2025, being organized by the Ministry from 7th to 9th November, 2025 in Gurugram, Haryana, will be an enriching, productive platform, yielding valuable outcomes for the future of India's urban mobility landscape.

Further, the planned expansion of the metro network extending from Millennium City Centre to Cyber Hub in Gurugram - alongside RRTS integration, marks a pivotal chapter in the state's urban transport development.
