A well-planned urban transport network is essential to address the burgeoning population's mobility needs, reduce traffic congestion, and minimise environmental impact in our cities. Under the leadership of Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi ji, we have recognised that an efficient public transport system is crucial for urban development. In the last 9 years, India has created seamless, multimodal networks that promotes accessibility and inclusivity for all citizens thereby prioritising 'moving people rather than vehicles.'

By integrating innovative technologies and promoting sustainable practices, the government has overcome uncertainties and is ensuring continuity and reliability to our urban mobility infrastructure. Integrated urban transport is not just about building efficient transit systems; it's about fostering connectivity across various modes. The Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs recently launched the PM e-bus Sewa scheme, which will fund operation of 10,000 electric buses in 169 cities.

This year, under the theme "Integrated and Resilient Urban Transport," I am confident that this conference will help in bringing out new and innovative ideas in improving urban mobility.

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MESSAGE

Urbanization planning in India constantly undergoes refinement with fresh perspectives of mobility patterns and choices. Several projects and programs for sustainable mobility and eco-friendly strategies, including the National Electric Mobility Mission have also gained traction. While India's National Commission on Population has projected that by 2036 about 600 million of population would be living in urban areas, UN has projected doubling of urban population from 461 million in 2018 to 877 million by 2050.
